THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 4) WARRANT, 1906.

Dated June 30, 1906.

1906. No. 511.

Warrant to be read as one with Inland Post Warrant 1903. Repeal of Clause 5 of Principal Warrant and substitution of new clause. Rates of postage on parcels.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2. Clause 5 of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be substituted in lieu thereof, namely:—
 - 5. There shall be charged and paid on parcels the following rates of postage, that is to say:—
 - On every parcel not exceeding one pound in weight, threepence.
 - On every parcel exceeding one pound and not exceeding two pounds, fourpence.
 - On every parcel exceeding two pounds and not exceeding three pounds, fivepence.
 - On every parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding five pounds, sixpence.

On every parcel exceeding five pounds and not exceeding seven pounds, sevenpence.

On every parcel exceeding seven pounds and not exceeding eight pounds, eightpence.

On every parcel exceeding eight pounds and not exceeding nine pounds, ninepence.

On every parcel exceeding nine pounds and not exceeding ten pounds, tenpence.

On every parcel exceeding ten pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds, elevenpence.

- 3. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1906."
- 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the Second day of July, 1906.
