INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 8) WARRANT, 1906.
DATED OCTOBER 19, 1906.

1906. No. 792.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

Repeal of Clause 15 of Principal Warrant and substitution of new Clause.

Make and size of Cards.

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2. Clause 15 of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be substituted in lieu thereof, namely:—
- 15.—(1) A private postcard and a private reply postcard must respectively be made of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the cardboard of which the thickest and not thinner than the cardboard of which the thinnest inland official postcard is, for the time being, made.
- (2) A private postcard shall not exceed five inches and half an inch in length and three inches and half an inch in width, or be less than four inches in length or two inches and three-quarters of an inch in width.
- (3) Neither part of a private reply postcard shall exceed five inches and half an inch in length or three inches and half an inch in width, or be less than four inches in length or two inches and three-quarters of an inch in width.

Repeal of Clause 16 of Principal Warrant and substitution of new Clause. 3. Clause 16 of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be substituted in lieu thereof, namely:—

Clause.

Nothing to be attached to Card.

- 16. Nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a postcard, except—
 - (a) Postage and inland revenue stamps, in payment of postage or stamp duty;
 - (b) Engravings and photographs on very thin paper and completely adherent; and

(c) A gummed label, not exceeding two inches in length or three-quarters of an inch in breadth, bearing the address at which the postcard is to be delivered and a similar label bearing the name and address of the sender of the postcard.

Provided that nothing in this Regulation contained shall prevent the use of a postcard in payment of postage on any postal packet.

- 4. This Warrant may be cited as "The Inland Post Amend-Short title. ment (No. 8) Warrant, 1906."
- 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1906.
