We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this

Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :-

- 1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title. Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1899.
- 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter referred to as be read with existing "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the Warrants.

3. From and after the date on which this Warrant comes into Parcels may operation, parcels may be transmitted by the post between the betransmitted to British Islands and Bolivia.

Bolivia.

4. On every outgoing parcel addressed to Bolivia there shall Rates of be charged and paid the rates of postage following, that is to postage thereon. say:-

- On a parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, Four shillings and twopence.
- On a parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, Four shillings and sevenpence.
- 5. All such parcels shall be subject to the same regulations as Regulations are applicable under the Principal Warrant to parcels transmitted as to such by the post between the British Islands and Paraguay.

6. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Rates of Warrant on parcels addressed to British Guiana and Zanzibar, postage on respectively, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels British the same rates as are payable under such Warrant on parcels Guiana and addressed to British Honduras.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of Commence-February, 1899.
