

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT  
(No. 2) WARRANT, 1899. DATED JANUARY 30, 1899.

1899. No. 18.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this

Rates :—Parcel Post (Bolivia, British Guiana, Zanzibar). 1075

Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1899." Short title.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898\* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

3. From and after the date on which this Warrant comes into operation, parcels may be transmitted by the post between the British Islands and Bolivia. Parcels may be transmitted to Bolivia.

4. On every outgoing parcel addressed to Bolivia there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage following, that is to say :— Rates of postage thereon.

On a parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, Four shillings and twopence.

On a parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, Four shillings and sevenpence.

5. All such parcels shall be subject to the same regulations as are applicable under the Principal Warrant to parcels transmitted by the post between the British Islands and Paraguay. Regulations as to such parcels.

6. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on parcels addressed to British Guiana and Zanzibar, respectively, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the same rates as are payable under such Warrant on parcels addressed to British Honduras. Rates of postage on parcels to British Guiana and Zanzibar.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1899. Commencement of Warrant.
