(No. 4) WARRANT, 1899. DATED MARCH 17, 1899.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows :—

| 1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1899." | Short title. |
| 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. | Warrant to be read with existing Warrant. |
| 3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on parcels addressed to Bermuda, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the same rates as are payable under such Warrant on parcels addressed to British Honduras. | Rates of postage to Bermuda. |
| 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the First day of April, 1899. | Commencement of Warrant. |
