

**Portuguese East Africa.**

**THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT  
(No. 16) WARRANT, 1908. DATED FEBRUARY 26, 1908.**

1908. No. 145.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's

Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post :—Portuguese 727  
East Africa.

Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 16) Warrant, 1908." Short title.
2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,\* and all Warrants amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.
3. In lieu of the rates of postage now payable on out-going parcels addressed to Portuguese East Africa, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the rates of postage specified in the Schedule hereto. Rates on parcels to Portuguese East Africa.
4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto. Maximum weight and dimensions.
5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1908. Commencement of Warrant.
