THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 25) WARRANT, 1908. DATED OCTOBER 26, 1908.

1908. No. 851.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 25) Warrant, 1908."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906\* (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

Extension of Principal Warrant. 3. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may be transmitted by post from the Agencies of the Postmaster-General established at the places specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto to the places specified opposite thereto respectively in the second column of the said Schedule, subject to the rates of postage mentioned therein against the names of such places respectively, as though such places had been included in Part III. of the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant.

Maximum weight and dimensions.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement of Warrant. 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1908.
