

**Morocco Ports.**

**THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT  
(No. 36) WARRANT, 1910. DATED AUGUST 9, 1910.**

1910. No. 854.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,\* and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 36) Warrant, 1910." Short title.
2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906† (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Extension of principal Warrant.

3. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may be transmitted by post from an Agency of the Postmaster-General established at a Morocco Port to places outside Morocco (other than the United Kingdom), by way of Gibraltar, subject to the rates of postage mentioned in the Schedule hereto, as though such places had been included in Part III. of the 2nd Schedule to the principal Warrant.

Maximum weight and dimensions.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 12th day of August, 1910.
