THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 41) WARRANT, 1911. DATED FEBRUARY 22, 1911.

## 1911. No. 142.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,\* and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows: -

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title. Parcel Post Amendment (No. 41) Warrant, 1911.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,† and all Warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to Katanga (Congo), there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage specified in the Schedule hereto.

Rates on parcels to Katanga.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Maximum weight and dimensions.
