- 3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to any place specified in Rates on the First Schedule hereto and transmitted under this Warrant there shall be charged and paid the amended rates of postage mentioned against the name of such place in the same Schedule.
- 4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall Maximum not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the First Schedule
- The Warrants specified in the Second Schedule hereto are Repeal. hereby repealed respectively to the extent mentioned in the same
- 6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 9th day of Commence-December, 1919.
