

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 1)
WARRANT, 1908. DATED MAY 28, 1908.

1908. No. 433.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907* (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

Repeal.

2. Sub-clause (2) of Clause 2 of the principal Warrant is hereby repealed.

Application of Principal Warrant to letters to British Postal Agencies in Morocco. Rates of postage on letters posted at British Postal Agencies in Morocco.

3. The principal Warrant shall apply to letters transmitted to British Postal Agencies in Morocco as if "British Postal Agencies in Morocco" were inserted in the 2nd Schedule to the said Warrant.

4. There shall be charged and paid—

(1) on every letter posted at a British Postal Agency in Morocco for transmission to the United Kingdom, to any of His Majesty's ships of War, or to any country or place specified in the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant, the following rates of postage, that is to say:—

If not exceeding 20 grammes in weight, 10 centimos.

If exceeding 20 grammes in weight, for each additional 20 grammes or fractional part of 20 grammes, 10 centimos.

(2) On every other letter posted as aforesaid—

If not exceeding 20 grammes in weight, 25 centimos.

If exceeding 20 grammes in weight, for each additional 20 grammes or fractional part of 20 grammes, 15 centimos.

Short title.

5. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1908."

ment.
