

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 6)
WARRANT, 1909. DATED NOVEMBER 27, 1909.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907* (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

2. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation, newspapers, magazines, and trade journals registered under the provisions of the principal Warrant as magazines for Canada shall also be transmissible by post as magazines for Newfoundland at the rates of postage and, except as hereinafter provided, subject to the conditions applicable under the principal Warrant to magazines for Canada and, except as aforesaid, the provisions of the principal Warrant shall apply to magazines for Newfoundland in like manner as they apply to magazines for Canada.

Special
conditions.

3. Every magazine for Newfoundland shall have an address in Newfoundland, and shall be transmitted either by a packet boat plying directly between the United Kingdom and Newfoundland or by a packet boat plying directly between the United Kingdom and Canada, and thence viâ Canada.
