**THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 14)
WARRANT, 1916. DATED AUGUST 30, 1916.**

1916. No. 592.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,^(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907^(b) (hereinafter called the Principal Warrant), and all Warrants amending the same.^(c)

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

2. The Principal Warrant shall have effect as if "Wei-hai-wei" were substituted for "British Postal Agencies in China" in the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant.

Amendment of Principal Warrant.

3. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 14) Warrant, 1916."

Short title.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1916.
