We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1918,(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907,(b) and all Warrants amending the same.

2. In lieu of the rates of postage now payable on British Rates of Letters and on outgoing letters posted in the United Kingdom for transmission to the United States of America, there shall be charged and paid on every such letter the following rates of postage, that is to say: -

On every letter not exceeding one ounce in weight, two- States of
