

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (NO. 4) WARRANT,
1923. DATED DECEMBER 31, 1923.

1923. No. 1622.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920,^(b) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1921^(a) (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.^(d)

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, such printed packets as the Postmaster-General shall direct to be so transmissible may be enclosed by the senders in mail bags, to be provided by the Postmaster-General for the purpose.

(2) Each such mail bag shall be of such weight and shall in respect of the make up and mode of posting of such mail bag and the payment of postage thereon and in all other respects conform with such rules as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe.

Foreign and Colonial Post : Transmission in bulk of 823
printed packets.

3.—(1) If arrangements shall be made for the transmission of printed packets under this Warrant in manner aforesaid for delivery to the same addressee, the weight and dimensions of the printed packets may be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe. Provided that the mail bag containing such printed packets does not exceed such weight as may be prescribed under this Warrant.

Transmission in bulk of printed packets to same addressee.

(2) Except as aforesaid, the weight and dimensions of printed packets transmitted under this Warrant shall not exceed those specified in the Principal Warrant.

4. There shall be charged and paid on every mail bag transmitted under this Warrant the rate of postage of fourpence for every pound in weight of the mail bag and its contents, provided that for this purpose the weight of each mail bag and its contents shall be calculated to the nearest pound.

Rates of postage.

5. This Warrant shall not affect the provisions of the Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1922,^(a) which relates to the transmission of magazines for Canada and Newfoundland.

Saving.

6. This Warrant may be cited as the " Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1923."

Short title.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1924.
